First long blast is the warning that signal will be given.

One Blast—Fair Weather

Two Long—Rain or Snow

Three Long—Local Rains

Four Long—Showers followed by Fair Weather.

One Short—Lower Temperature

Two Short—Higher Temperature

Three Short—Cold Wave

Explanation of Combination Blasts

One Long alone—Fair Weather, Stationary Temperature

Two Long alone—Rain or Snow, Stationary Temperature

One Long and one Short—Fair Weather, Lower Temperature

Two Long and Two Short—Rain or Snow, Higher Temperature

Three Long and One Short—Local Rains, Lower Temperature

Three Long Two Short—Local Rains, Higher Temperature

Interesting Information About the City of Marion, Ohio.

POPULATION—Nearly 25000 (more than double within the past 10 years); has many miles of paving, side walks and sewers.

Has about 7000 private residences; Street Car lines, Motor Car lines, Electric Light plant; Natural gas for light and heat; an up to date Telephone system; water system, pumping from many deep wells; three fire departments with hose and motor equipment; has many new store and office buildings; live and progressive merchants; a Commercial Club that is constantly endeavoring to make a bigger and better city. The spring of 1914 promises the biggest building boom in our history.

SCHOOLS—12 buildings with 2 grade and one high school building about to be constructed; one Catholic school; fully 4000 school children attending school.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS—Court House, Public Library, Three new Fire Stations, new Federal building.

CHURCHES—23 churches and 8 missions. Fully 9000 members of the various denominations, with an equal number attending sunday schools.

BANKS—Five in number; have a total capital stock and surplus of more than a million and a quarter, and deposits totaling nearly three millions.

MANUFACTURING—The city has over 40 plants manufacturing various articles, chief among which are Steam Shovels, Dredges, Engines, Threshers, Pianos, Sulkies, Silk, Shoes, Band Instruments, Mattresses, Brick, Cement Block, Lime, Ice and Flour.

PRINCIPAL MANUFACTORIES—The Marion Steam Shovel Co.; The Huber Mfg. Co.; The Fairbanks Steam Shovel Co.; The Ohio Tractor Mfg. Co., The Marion-Osgood Co.; total capital stock of nearly three millions and a half; employing fully 3500 people, with an average monthly pay roll of a quarter of a million dollars.

RAILROADS—Five railroads and two Internurban lines. Is a division point for two roads and has extensive yards; also a freight transfer station, repair shops and round house. Three thousand railroad men live here; the average monthly pay roll is \$200,000.
